

Working with the Navigation

- The navigation of your site is the way in which your content is displayed on your page.
- Main navigation these appear as a main menu on your homepage. (Depending on your theme it will look similar to the one below:



• Secondary Navigation - a child of the main navigation




• Tertiary Navigation - a child of the secondary navigation





The navigation of your site is easily manipulated.
Website Content - Navigation




- The arrows on the right hand side can change your navigation.
 - Hard Left Main Navigation
 - Indented Once Secondary Navigation
 - Indented Twice Tertiary Navigation



• If I were to "Outdent" position 6 in the navigation – "Policies". This would me an it would become a main navigation tab.



 You can easily change this back by indenting the page using the arrows on the right.

CHANGING POSITIONS

If you would prefer your content to be placed in a different order, you can use the UP and DOWN arrows to change the order they appear in the navigation.




In this instance, we moved "Child Safety" UP to positions using the arrows on the right.



If you need to change positions that requires a big movement – it is often easier to delete the page from Navigation and insert it in the new area. Eq. Moving Position 20 up to Position 6.




- Click on the blue cross on the right hand side of your "Enrolment" page. (This is removing from the Navigation not deleting the page).
- Go to Position 5 of your navigation and click the the green + button






• A drop down menu with Homepage will appear. Click on the drop down.



• Find your enrolment page, then click on the green tick.





CHANGING PAGE NAMES

You can modify the name of the page as it appears on your navigation and give it a different name (often useful when your navigation menu is full or your page name is quite long).

• Click on the pencil beside the page name (on the right)



 Put your cursor in the box with the page name and type your new name.



• Click on the green tick and check out your site.
